2. Application requirements and additional information

2.1. Application

All applications of exchange students have to be submitted online.

The next application period for winter and summer term will be 01.04. – 15.05.2023

Before applying, students have to register for an application account. This can be done any time after the official beginning of the application period.

The Link to our Online-Application-Platform will be published on our website.

In order to apply students need to upload the following documents:

- Nomination Letter
- Passport sized picture
- Copy of ID or passport
- Curriculum Vitae
- Portfolio (15 pages max.)
- Language Certificate German or English B1*

*Courses are usually taught in German at AdBK Munich, therefore we recommend to have a basic understanding of German before applying. Please note that theory courses are only offered in German.

2.2. Recommended language skills

The sending institution, following agreement with our institution, is responsible for providing support to its nominated candidates so that they can have the recommended language skills at the start of the study or teaching period:

2.3. Calendar

2.3.1 Application and Nomination:

The next application period for winter <u>and</u> summer term 2023/2024 will be **01.04.–15.05.2023**. Link to the online application: *Link will be published on our website*.

2.3.2. Decision Response

At the beginning of June, a commission of professors decides on the admission of incoming Erasmus+ students. A letter of acceptance will be mailed immediately after the decision.

2.4. Learning Agreement and Transcript of Records

2.4.1. General Information

Before students create their Learning Agreement, they should please read the "Instructions for completing the Incoming-LA".

The course catalogue is usually published on the homepage of the AdBK Munich shortly before the semester starts, so students should enter their main subject / class and the abstract names of the courses in the Learning Agreement *Before the Mobility* first. Example:

- 1. Artistic work in class / project work (only one "main" class à 15 ECTS can be registered here)
- 2. Workshop (e.g. new media, metal, wood, ceramics, etc.)
- 3. Theory (Please note that Theory courses are only offered in German!)

A Transcript of Records will be issued at the end of the exchange.

2.4.2. Fine Arts / Art Education

The Fine Arts programme at the AdBK Munich is based on the class system, meaning that each student is initially assigned to a class and a specific professor. In addition, students can choose from a wide range of so-called "cross-curricular offers" (Studiengangsübergreifendes Angebot) (e.g. theory, interdisciplinary studies, study workshops, life drawing and various

teaching assignments). The following list is an overview of the <u>possible</u> credits students can obtain by taking courses / seminars or workshops. The following applies: As a rule, students will receive 15 ECTS credits for the work in the class in which they are studying (provided successful participation).

2.4.4. Architecture and Art

The Master's programme Architecture and Art is aimed at design-oriented students who have completed a Bachelor's degree in architecture. The prerequisite is a pronounced interest in building culture, the design process as well as interdisciplinary work in an artistic environment in order to consolidate and deepen this during the Master's programme. The teaching content of the degree programme is predominantly project-oriented. Further information can be found in the module handbook on our homepage (in German only). Every semester students must chose two modules:

- Free format Architecture and Art (15 ECTS credits) (modules 1-3a)

These modules are designed as interdisciplinary research and artistic work.

- Architectural Project work (15 ECTS credits) (modules 1-3b)

These modules are architectural project work. Based on a clearly defined work structure, theses, strategies or design concepts are examined, developed and completed. Essentially, urban planning, construction, building envelope, technology, function and atmosphere are dealt with.
